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Registration

How do I register for the event?

Please visit professional.heart.org and click the Register Now button.

- Individual attendees are required to have a Professional Heart Daily profile to register. To create a profile, go to <u>PHD</u>, click the "Login" button in top right-hand corner, then click "Sign-up". If you have previously set up an account on PHD but cannot locate your login information, please click <u>here</u>.
- Forgot your password? Please go here.
- If you register to attend this year's conference in person, you will also receive access to the conference online. Look for your registration confirmation email containing your registration number (required to access the conference online).
- For group registration, please go <u>here</u>. You will find a form at the bottom of the page to complete & submit. From there, the Group Registration team will review your submission and respond to you with any questions or next steps.

How do I access the virtual event?

On Monday, February 6th the day the Virtual Platform opens at 9am CT (Dallas), all registrants will receive a follow-up confirmation e-mail with their Last Name, Registration/Badge Number, and a link to access the virtual event.

Click the link provided in your email, enter your **Last Name** (exactly as it was entered for registration) and your provided **Registration/Badge Number**.

How will the content be delivered?

Programming will be presented on-site in Dallas, TX, and virtually through livestreamed and on-demand sessions. *On-Demand content will be available within 24 hours of the session concluding on-site in Dallas*.

Will sessions be available for viewing after the last day of the event?

Registered attendees will have access to the virtual content to view at their convenience for up to 7-days from the end of the conference through February 17th, 2023 at 11:59pm CT. All attendees will need is their Last Name (as registered) and their Registration/Badge Number to access the virtual conference.

IMPORTANT: CME/CE credit is only available to claim for sessions viewed during the live portion of the meeting from **February 7 – 10**. CME/CE is not available for sessions viewed after **February 10, 2023**.

Can I get Sessions OnDemand if I need more time to view sessions or need CE credit?

Need more time to view all the virtual ISC 2023 content? <u>Stroke OnDemand</u> will launch shortly after the conference and will grant access to over 100 sessions, with CE opportunities available on selected sessions through January 31st, 2024.

Enduring CME will be available for selected sessions. Pricing is \$299 for AHA Professional Members and \$499 for Non-Members. Prior to the conference, Stroke OnDemand is only available for purchase with registration as part of Gold package registration. If you have registered for the conference, but did not originally purchase Gold package registration, you can upgrade your registration to Gold package via the <u>Registration Resource Center</u> for the +\$299/+\$499 price in addition to your registration cost.

<u>Stroke OnDemand</u> will launch shortly after the conference and will grant access to content through **January 31, 2024**. Over 100 sessions Enduring CE will be available for selected sessions.

How do I navigate the event platform?

AHA has designed a simple navigation method for attendees. At the top of the event platform home page, attendees have 4 main options to choose from:

Is there an agenda for the event?

Attendees can access the schedule of events via the <u>Online Program and Itinerary Planner</u> or the Mobile App. Additionally, there is an overview of the live streaming content available under "Schedule at a Glance." in the Mobile App. Additionally, there is an overview of the event platform under "Schedule at a Glance."

How do I access Posters?

Attendees can view the International Stroke Conference 2023 ePosters beginning February 8 at 8am CT (Dallas). Once on the home page for International Stroke Conference 2023, click the "Programming", then the "Posters" Tab. To view the ePosters, you do not need an additional login and password; however, to interact with other attendees or presenters in the poster area, you may be required to create a login and password and will be prompted once in the Poster area. Attendees should only have to login once & will be automatically recognized each subsequent visit.

Attendees can view the ePosters, read the abstracts, listen to any audio recording, or video, and send questions to the presenters via email using the "Ask the Author" feature. Enjoy abstracts and audio recordings in the palm of your hand! Abstracts will be available on Thursday, February 2, 2023 at 4:00 AM CT (Dallas).

Will Continuing Education Credit be offered?

IMPORTANT: CME/CE credit is only available to claim for sessions viewed during the live portion of the meeting from **February 7 – 10**. CME/CE is not available for sessions viewed after **February 10, 2023**.

Professional attendees will be able to claim up to **23.0 CE credits** for participation in the virtual conference activity. Nursing Symposium attendees can claim up to **6.5 CE credits**. The number of **CE credits** for Stroke in the Real-World are still being finalized and will be posted on our <u>Continuing Education</u> page once available.

Instructions for Claiming CE Credits for International Stroke Conference

- 1) Log In
- Go to AHA's Lifelong Learning Center at <u>learn.heart.org</u>.
- Click Activities in Progress
- Enter your Username and Password and Sign In.
- If you do not remember your Username or Password, click the Forgot Password link.

2) Select Event and Activity

- Select the International Stroke Conference 2023 activity.
- Review the Activity Overview, scroll to bottom and click Continue.
- View the contents of **Activity Material** page and click Continue.
- Pharmacists will select the specific sessions attended.

3) Claim Credit

- Complete the **conference evaluation**, which is required to claim credit. Once complete, click **Submit**, and **Continue**.
- Click the Claim button for the appropriate accreditation.

- ACCME and ANCC allow claiming of variable credit. You can claim all or part of the activity credit according to your user profile.
- \circ $\;$ Select the credit amount before clicking the Claim button.
- Click Continue to generate your certificate.
- Click **Finish**. The activity is stored under Transcript.

CE/CME General Assistance:

For your CME/CE you do not need to track your sessions (unless seeking ACPE Pharmacist credit). At the end of the Meeting, you will be able to go in and claim your credit.

You will only claim **once** for the meeting and receive an email with further instructions. You are strongly encouraged to claim your CME/CE credit within 30 days of the conclusion of the conference.

What is the best browser to access ISC23 online?

We support the most current version of the popular browsers: Chrome, Safari, Edge, and Firefox.

Chrome is the preferred browser. IE 11 is no longer supported as Vimeo Livestream is critical and unavailable on IE.

What to do if you are unable to login

- Ensure that you are disconnected from the institution/company VPN.
- There might be a problem with the web browser's cache and cookies. Try logging in using an "incognito" feature (which usually ignores all your stored cache and cookies). *While using incognito, some site features may not function properly.
- If logging in via incognito works, you might need to clear your browser's cache and cookies to be able to log in from a normal window again.

How to Clear Browser Cache

Every browser has a different way of clearing cache and cookies, so you will have to check how to do this depending on what you are using.

Chrome

- On your computer, open Chrome.
- At the top right, click the 3 stacked dots.
- Click "More tools".
- Click "Clear browsing data."
 - At the top, choose a time range.
 - To delete everything, select All time
 - Next to "Cookies and other site data " and "Cached images and files", check the boxes.
 - Click "Clear data".

Edge

- On your computer, open Edge.
- Press the keys [Ctrl], [Shift] and [Del].
- A new Window opens. Select the option "temporary services and files".
- Confirm your selection by clicking on the "delete" button.

FireFox

- Click the menu button at the top right (3 stacked lines) and select "Settings".
- Select the "Privacy & Security" panel.
 - In the "Cookies and Site Data" section, click "Clear Data".
 - \circ $\;$ Remove the checkmark in front of "Cookies and Site Data".
 - \circ $\;$ With "Cached Web Content" check marked, click the "Clear" button.
 - Close the "about: preferences" page.

Safari

- Open "Settings".
- Tap "Safari".
- Tap "Clear History and Website Data"

Trouble logging in: Corporate IT Settings / Antivirus and Firewall Software

Some corporate IT settings will block websites. These corporate Antivirus and Firewall software sometimes automatically block certain websites out of minor suspicions, and the web page following the login page might have been blocked, causing you to be unable to login.

If you think there might be a problem with your Antivirus or Firewall software, you can try logging in using a different device. For example, if you are normally log in from a desktop computer, try logging in using your mobile phone.

Troubleshooting Livestream:

- Turn off Ad-Blocker on your browser
- Login using a personal device
