

Case Reports and Images Submission Guidelines 2025

Abstract Submission

Provide unique clinical cases or images that represent novel or interesting aspects of resuscitation science. Given that 2025 is the year in which the new guidelines will be released, we are especially interested in cases that might support or challenge current resuscitation guidelines.

Only one image is allowable for submission. Please ensure a high-quality image without any identifying information, that is acceptable for publication. Images with patient or device identifiers will be removed from the submission.

Structure of Submission

Case Reports and Images Abstracts may have the following identifiable sections: Case Presentation, Differential Diagnosis, Treatment and Management, Outcome and Discussion/Teaching Points

- 1. Title*
- 2. Case Presentation* Detailed patient information including: demographics, medical history, symptoms and clinical findings, and diagnostic tests/results. NOTE: Do NOT include patient names. Proprietary information cannot be revealed (for example: descriptors such as "surface cooling device" or "automated piston-based CPR device" are acceptable, trade names or device names are not)
- 3. Differential Diagnosis Discussion of the potential diagnoses considered and the reasoning behind the final diagnosis.
- 4. Treatment and Management* Details of the treatment provided, including any procedures, medications, or interventions.
- 5. Outcome and Follow-Up Results of the treatment and the patient's progress over time.
- 6. Teaching Points* Analysis of the case, comparing it with existing literature, highlighting unique aspects, and discussing implications for clinical practice.

Abstract Acceptance

Accepted case study abstracts will be poster only and presented in the ReSS25 poster sessions. Acceptance notifications will be sent out early August.

Case study abstracts will not be considered for awards.
