Dr. Brian Chan is an associate professor of medicine at Oregon Health & Science University (OHSU) in the Department of Medicine, division of general internal medicine and geriatrics, addiction medicine section. Dr. Chan is engaged in an academic, translational-research career in community partnered research and implementation of interventions to address medical (cardiometabolic) consequences of substance use disorders (SUD) and health inequities in care of people with SUD. His clinical expertise is caring for underserved populations with addictions and is board certified in addiction medicine. He currently serves as multiple principal investigator on an American Heart Association (AHA) rural health equity project implementing screening and treatment for methamphetamine associated cardiomyopathy as part of the RURAL PRO-CARE network. He is also a recipient of a National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA) K23 career development award which aims to design and implement a community-partnered innovative care model to improve treatment retention and health outcomes for medically complex patients with opioid use disorder seen in primary care and is a current implementation research institute (IRI) fellow. He was the primary investigator of an Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ K12) evaluation of a novel integrated primary care model of care to improve outcomes for medically and socially complex patient populations seen at a federally qualified health center.
