 - <u>Cardiovascular Seminar</u>: These sessions, focused on a specific topic or area of science, provide an opportunity for attendees to become more thoroughly acquainted with (a) state-of-the-art topics of special interest, (b) a "how-to" session of new cardiovascular techniques and therapeutic interventions or (c) interaction among invited "experts" and attendees.
 - <u>Early Career:</u> Focused topics important for individuals who are in fellows in training or early.
 - Main Event: These sessions inform attendees of new and broad concepts in cardiovascular medicine. Proposals for main event sessions should appeal to a broad audience and have a multi-disciplinary focus. Recognized experts with skills in communication and teaching present these state-of-the-art lectures. These sessions will draw a large, broad audience.

*Session Format

- <u>Bootcamp</u>: Hands-on session that provides both learning and application opportunities for audience members.
- Core Cardiology: Practical guidance for the general cardiologist that can be taken back to work the next week.
- o <u>Didactic Lecture:</u> Traditional style presentation with discussion at the end.
- o Debate: Opposing positions on a topic are presented and then discussed.
- Flipped Classroom: Education strategy that focuses on engagement of learners through interactive learning instead of a lecture style. Learning happens in the individual space and discussion/application and takes place with the group during the sessions.
- Rapid Fire: Short presentations to cover a single subject, viewpoint or data set to encourage many different ideas or topics in a single session.
- <u>TED Style Presentation:</u> Presentations designed to spark ideas, challenge assumptions, and accelerate scientific progress with a key take-away from each presentation.
