

Dr. Angela G. Spencer is a Research Scientist with the Global Cardiovascular Program at the University of Washington Department of Global Health, School of Medicine. She uses multiple methods to implement and scale up evidence-based practices in both community and healthcare settings. She joined UW as postdoctoral fellow in fall 2023 with the American Heart Association-funded GROW-Rural team, applying human-centered design and community-based participatory methods to adapt cardiovascular care innovations from rural regions of low-and-middle income countries for implementation in healthcare settings in the rural western United States. Dr. Spencer continues to work with GROW-Rural as Research Scientist and now serves as Principal Investigator for the Advancing Community Outreach, Research, and Native Solutions (ACORNS) for Healthy Hearts project. Her research interests include how the structure of health systems and community networks influence the health of Indigenous and rural populations.

Dr. Spencer was raised in Northern California and Northeastern Oklahoma. She is a citizen of the Cherokee Nation and the United States. She earned her BA in Psychology at Western Colorado University, an MBA at Southern Oregon University, and a PhD in Community Health at the Oregon Health & Science University – Portland State University School of Public Health.
