Dr. McKay Mullen attended Morehouse College, Atlanta, and obtained a *B.S. in* Psychology in 2008. He then joined Morehouse School of Medicine in Atlanta and obtained a master's degree in biomedical research in 2015 and a Ph.D. in Biomedical Science in 2021, studying the effect of chemotherapy on triple-negative breast cancer. From 2021-2023 he was a postdoctoral scholar at Stanford's Cardiovascular Institute, where he used induced pluripotent stem cells (iPSCs) to study oncology and the adverse impact of chemotherapy on the heart (i.e., cardio-oncology). He is currently a postdoctoral scholar at Georgia's Prevention Institute (GPI) at Augusta University. As a postdoctoral fellow, his research has focused on evaluating racial disparities as they relate to cardio-oncology. Specifically, he plans to continue studying the impact of chemotherapy on the cardiovascular system and evaluate whether racial disparities influence healthcare outcomes.
